

- All entries must be entered online by 11 pm on Wednesday 28th August at www.corsleyfayre.org.uk
- All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and in the case of vegetables, fruit and flowers in Divisions A and B must have been in his or her own cultivation prior to the day of the Fayre.
- All exhibits, where applicable, shall be displayed in or on containers supplied by the exhibitor.
- The judges' decisions in all cases will be final.
- Certificates will be awarded at 3pm. No exhibits may be removed before 4pm.
- The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur to exhibits.

Note

The Horticulture and Crafts marquee will be open to receive exhibits on Saturday 31st August from 8am until 9am when judging of Divisions A, B, E and H will commence. The public will 'vote' for the best/their favourite exhibit in Divisions C, D, F, G using tokens.

The marquee will be closed at 9am on the day of the Fayre – please don't be late with your entries!! The marquee will be cleared of exhibitors at 9 am prompt for judging of Divisions A, B and E, H to commence.

Artwork and photographs are only covered by our insurance for reproduction costs.

Notes for exhibitors

- Entries can only be submitted online at: www.corsleyfayre.org.uk
- Previous experience has shown that the high humidity of the marquee can cause severe deterioration of paper and card-based exhibits, particularly photographs. The committee regrets it cannot accept responsibility for loss of, or damage to, exhibits.
- Exhibitors in Division *G* (Handicrafts) are responsible for providing their own hanging/display materials.
- To comply with Health & Safety rules, all food items should be covered.
- Please place your exhibitor card face down next to your exhibit.
- We strongly encourage anonymous explanatory notes to accompany exhibits. For
 example, to name the variety of fruit, vegetable or flower entries or to explain stitches,
 metalwork or woodworking techniques or other features in a craft item or ingredients in
 a homecraft item. Please make the notes no bigger than A5.

Preserves (marmalade, jam, jelly, curd, chutney)

Preserves should be in 1lb/454g plain glass jam jars and should be sealed with either a
new twist-top lid or a waxed disc and a cellophane cover, secured with an elastic band.
All preserves should be labelled with the name of the preserve and dated.
